Re: Metro Vancouver Congestion Improvement Tax Plebiscite

At GVHBA board meetings on December 16, 2014 and January 20, 2015, the GVHBA board of directors considered whether or not GVHBA should pledge its support to the Better Transit and Transportation Coalition (BTTC). Current membership of BTTC is listed at the end of this memo.

Although every board member recognized the value that an improved transit system would bring to the community and to our industry, the following reservations to becoming a supporter of BTTC were raised:

- 1. Administration: Concern that the new tax proceeds would not be prudently managed and expended as proposed in the plebiscite;
- 2. Sunset clause: Concern that there is no declared end-date for the new tax; and
- 3. Use of funds: Concern that TransLink may ultimately use the proceeds for operating rather than capital expenses, as publicly declared.

On February 4, 2015 a group of GVHBA board members met with Metro Vancouver Chair and Port Coquitlam Mayor Greg Moore to discuss the above concerns. Moore, who is also a leading member of the Mayor's Council on Regional Transportation, responded to the concerns as follows:

- 1. Administration: An arms length oversight entity will be created that will annually review a performance audit of the envisioned capital expansion and will have the powers to stop the release of funds for subsequent years of the plan upon non-performance. Details about how such powers would be enshrined are still being worked out, but it is expected that the oversight entity would be lead by a majority of independent representation;
- 2. Sunset clause: It was explained that although the proposed plan involves a 10-year capital expansion, the project is financed over a 25-year horizon therefore the near-term value of a sunset clause loses its importance. During the next 25-years TransLink and the Mayor's Council will review alternative funding sources to supplement and/or replace the new tax proceeds should they arise;
- 3. Use of funds: It was pointed out that the new equipment buses, trains, etc. would necessitate an increase in operating costs and that part of the new funds raised would have to be put to that use, particularly in the period beyond the initial 10-years of expansion.

On balance, I felt that the GVHBA board members presented a breadth and depth of questions that Mayor Moore handled well, and I left the meeting more comfortable with a "yes" vote than when I arrived. I would, therefore recommend the board approve the following draft motion:

"Be it Resolved that the GVHBA Board of Directors supports a "Yes" vote in the upcoming Metro Vancouver Congestion Improvement Tax Plebiscite, approves a formal statement of support for the Better Transit and Transportation Coalition, and urges its member companies, employees and associates to vote 'Yes' in the coming plebiscite."
